

OWN YOUR EXAMINATION TIMETABLE

You will receive a copy of your timetable

 Keep a copy in your bag and one at home, preferably in the kitchen for the family to see



YOUR TIMETABLE TELLS YOU YOUR ROOM AND SEAT NUMBER

- These may be different for each exam
- Please make sure you know which room you should be in and which seat

 In large venues look at the letters at the front and numbers down the side to find your seat



MORNING EXAM SIGN IN – HIGH OPTIONS

- Ensure you have your ID badge with you
- Exams MUST start at 9.00
- For morning exams you must sign in at High Options between
 8.15am and 8.40am and check your seat number
- You will be sent to your exam at 8.45am
- When instructed, you will go from High Options to your exam venue
- At the end of your exam you must leave in silence



AFTERNOON SIGN IN – HIGH OPTIONS

- Exams MUST start at 1.30pm
- For afternoon exams you must sign in at High Options between 12.45pm and 1.00pm
- Check your seat number
- You will then be told when to go to your exam venue
- At the end of your exam you must leave in silence

• Sign in in High Options at the start of Period 4

• Eat lunch then



- You must not bring unauthorised items into any examination venue eg:
 - Mobile phone
 - ANY watch
 - Any other electronic communication device
 - Vapes are included in this category
 - Notes of any kind

 In the past GCSE and A-level candidates at Wilmslow High have had their papers cancelled by the exam board, because they have been found with a mobile or watch even though it was in their pocket/ switched off



CALCULATORS

 Students using graphical calculators or powerful scientific calculators must clear the calculator memory – this may be checked

Make sure you know how to use your calculator

 If your calculator is in the wrong mode the invigilators will not be allowed to help you to fix it and will not lend you another calculator



DO NOT BRING

DO NOT BRING YOUR COAT/BAG/NOTES/ BOOKS/PHONE/WATCH/iPAD TO THE EXAM VENUE

You can leave phones, electronic devices and watches in the box which will go to Student Services

You can leave bags/coats in High Options



BRING YOUR ID CARD TO ALL EXAMS AND PLACE ON THE DESK FACE UP

- ID cards prevent malpractice
- This is so that invigilators can check that the right student is sitting the correct paper and helps to ensure that you are sitting in the correct seat
- If you feel that you have been given an incorrect paper query this with an invigilator by raising your hand
- Lost your ID? get it sorted!
- Full, legal names on the exam paper



COLOURED CARDS ON DESKS

• Red = extra time

• Blue = rest breaks

• Pink = prompter

• Green = exam clash



MALPRACTICE

- Be very careful to do nothing which is against the rules or gives you any unfair advantage
- Anything that could give you even the slightest unfair advantage is malpractice
- Have <u>nothing</u> written on your hands; not even your seat number
- Have no notes in your pocket or on your person
- There will be spot checks involving a random sample of students
- Be aware that we always report malpractice



TOILETS

Go before the exam

 If you are allowed to go during an exam you will be escorted and will be asked to turn your pockets out

 We keep a record of names of those who have to be allowed to go to the toilet



THERE MUST BE TOTAL SILENCE AT <u>ALL TIMES</u> IN THE ASSESSMENT ROOM

YOU MUST NOT COMMUNICATE IN ANY WAY WITH ANY OTHER CANDIDATE – EVEN BY GESTURE OR EYE CONTACT

STUDENTS ENTITLED TO EXTRA TIME ARE ENCOURAGED TO USE IT



LEAVING THE EXAM

When dismissed by the lead invigilator:

leave in total silence

 keep moving; do not stop in the foyer/hallway as other students may still be working



BRILLIANT BASICS

 DO NOT WRITE ANYTHING ON YOUR PAPER UNTIL YOU ARE INVITED TO DO SO

FULL CORRECT SCHOOL UNIFORM MUST BE WORN

ID Badges must be worn

Invigilators are your support



NO FOOD IS TO BE CONSUMED DURING AN ASSESSMENT

• Small bottles of water will be permitted, with the label removed and bottle placed on the floor

Absolutely no chewing gum



OTHER DOS AND DON'TS

- Timetables must not be brought into the exam
- Doodling is not allowed on papers as examiners may refuse to mark them
- Fingernails (if using a computer) must not be too long as this can prevent you being able to type or cause a distraction to others
- Only write in the designated sections of answer books
- If you need continuation paper check the back of the booklet for spare pages, if none raise your hand and ask an invigilator
- Write *see continuation pages at the end of your sentence so the examiner knows there is more of your answer to mark
- Put the question number immediately on the continuation paper. Leave at least two lines between each answer
- Your name, candidate number etc. can be added onto the continuation paper at the end of the exam



HAVE THE CORRECT EQUIPMENT

- It will be too late to buy equipment immediately before an exam
- Black pens, sharpened HB pencils, rubbers, rulers, calculators, protractors, compasses should be in a <u>clear</u> <u>pencil case</u> or plastic bag
- No erasable pens
- Calculator lids must not be taken into the examination room
